From Disciples to Apostles (cont...)

Something must be done. Drastic action is required. Over the last four years, in my present parish of Saint Benedict, after over-turning a few figurative card tables, we did regain control of our facilities. Since then, we have seen almost 2,000 people participate in Alpha, with 20% to 30% being non-churchgoers. We have run hundreds of different faith formation events or programs and have seen hundreds of lives changed and transformed as people encountered the person of Jesus Christ, in the power of the Holy Spirit. Through these experiences, they have come to know God as their Father and have come alive in their experience of God's family, the Church. All this through the grace of God, which has enabled us to rediscover our new identity through Pope John Paul II's call for the New Evangelization, whose roots are in the Second Vatican Council.

Rebuild my House

From Vatican II to Pope Francis

Do you remember where you were on March 13, 2013? I bet you do. It was the day that Jorge Bergoglio was introduced to world as Francesco. Although rumoured to have been a close second in the previous conclave that elected Pope Benedict, Cardinal Bergoglio was a relative unknown and was on no list of the pundits for the 2013 election. I remember where I was when I heard the news, and I remember my first words: "Who?" and "Francesco!" Although he would go on to explain his choice of name based on his love for the poor, my first thoughts were that this man was declaring himself to be a reformer after the saint who heard the Lord say to him, "Francis, rebuild my house, which as you see is falling into ruin." I like to believe that he chose this name for both reasons, and his actions so far as pope would confirm this hope.

Since that momentous day, Pope Francis has exploded onto the international scene. He speaks to all Christians with clarity and urgency, challenging us to recall our identity and to be a Church that goes out and a Church that makes "missionary disciples." In doing this, he continues the call of his predecessor, who spoke often of the New Evangelisation and called for the reevangelisation of the West.

The Second Vatican Council

There is no doubt about the priority of evangelisation in the Church teaching over the last number of years. To truly understand the call to the New Evangelisation, we must begin by looking at something that happened over 50 years ago: the Second Vatican Council (1962–1965). This Council would produce sixteen documents, each an original synthesis of traditional Catholic doctrine and new theological insight. Without any academic attempt to support my statement, I would like to claim that the central theological insights of all sixteen conciliar documents can be summed up in the following phrases: the universal call to holiness and the universal call to mission. Holiness and mission are not new in the teaching of Church, but the stress on the universal nature of these things was relatively new. The idea that the call to holiness and mission is rooted not in ordination or in religious profession but in baptism had been so forgotten that it was revolutionary. We are called to holiness because we are baptised. We are called to mission, to evangelise, to share the Good News because we are baptised.

Pope Paul VI

Ten years to the day after the Council was closed, Pope Paul VI released a groundbreaking document called Evangelii Nuntiandi, which means "Announcing the Good News." Its title in English is "Evangelisation in the Modern World." This document enunciated a theology for mission and evangelisation that is the responsibility of all Christians. Since the close of the Council, it remains the most profound call for the Church to rediscover her identifv.

Let us begin with how Pope Paul VI defines evangelisation:

It has been possible to define evangelisation In the terms of proclaiming Christ to those who do not know Him, of preaching, of catechesis, of conferring Baptism and the other Sacraments. (EN, no. 17)

We see right away that he chose a broad definition of evangelisation. It includes all of the tasks that make up the Great Commission, but also includes most of the activities of the Church: preaching, catechesis, teaching, sacraments, and proclamation, or kerygma.

Pope Paul also reminds us that we must avoid the temptation of thinking that the witness of our lives alone is sufficient to evangelise. As he says, "the Good News proclaimed by the witness of life, sooner or later has to be proclaimed by the word of life." (EN, no.22) This is a very important principle for us today, as it emphasizes the proclamation or kerygmatic dimension of Pope Paul VI's definition.
