GUIDELINES FOR ST PETER'S PASTORAL MISSION GROUP

Vision

Saint Peter's Parish is a healthy and growing faith community that brings people to Christ, forms disciples and sends them out to transform the world. Our members commit to worship, to grow, to serve, to connect and to give.

Mission

Our mission is to form disciples who joyfully live out the mission of Jesus Christ. We do this by:

Offering an invitation to welcome others into our community

Encouraging people to encounter Jesus through the Kerygma

Giving of ourselves to make other disciples through Alpha groups

Connecting and sharing lasting friendships with other joyful disciples

Serving in Ministry groups in the parish

Growing and learning as a disciple of Jesus

Worshiping together as a community of disciples especially in the Eucharist

Purpose of the Pastoral Mission Group

The Pastoral Mission Group (PMG) participates in living out the mission of the Church by its members being disciples of Jesus and assisting in leading our faith community. It is a forum for the laity, religious and clergy to come together as representatives of the parish, in order to share the responsibility for growth in the life of the whole parish community.

For the Parish Priest, the PMG is also an important forum where he and fellow parishioners explore and reflect on the many elements and issues of parish life, as well as address specific concerns and generate new initiatives.

The primary focus of the PMG is to bring people to Christ, form disciples and send them out to transform the world. This is done by the 3-stage process of:

Listening and Exploring – the PMG seeks to know the community, understand its needs, hopes and gifts, and how these relate to the parish vision and mission.

Praying and Reflecting – the PMG with available information reaches a stage of discernment which includes discussion, prayer and deliberation about the areas of mission in the parish and the gifts of its members.

Proposing Practical Steps and Priorities – the PMG enters the planning stage, developing particular goals and strategies for the coming year which call forth the gifts of its members and involve them in particular areas of mission. They will coordinate with parish groups and foster a supportive pastoral environment. Members will liaise with representatives of parish groups.

Pastoral Mission Team's Guiding Principles

At the heart of the establishment of the PMG is the commitment to move our parish from simply maintaining ourselves to becoming a missionary community of disciples of Jesus Christ.

The PMG is a team comprising a number of parishioners and parish leaders with their Parish Priest fundamentally committed to the parish vision. They must hold a current Working With Children Check Card (WWCC) or be a current registered member of the Victorian Institute of Teaching (VIT).

The PMG members aspire to be:

Spiritual Leaders – providing a good example of Christian living

Servant Leaders – offering their gifts to the community not from a sense of power but rather from an attitude of shared responsibility

Collaborative – working together with shared goals

Approachable – known by parishioners and accessible and available to them

Good listeners – seeking the input of parishioners regarding their concerns in order to establish the direction of the parish to progress the parish vision

Change Agents – fulfilling their visionary role through active participation in the process of discernment and planning

Enablers – making opportunities available to all parishioners to become involved in the life of the parish community

Teachable – open to being formed.

The PMG's role is to offer considered advice and assistance to the Parish Priest on ways and actions centered on and inspired by Jesus Christ which proclaims the Gospel in terms that are relevant for members of the community and which builds the parish community as a communion for mission.
